LUNCH: A suitable hostelry in Oxford

TEA: To be confirmed

DISTANCE: About 5 miles, returning from an "Oxford Tube" stop in Oxford.

FARE: £16 (£8 concessions) same day or next day return London - Oxford.

The walk will be arranged so as to arrive at the Oxford Oratory in good time for the processional entry of the relic of St Therese which is expected at 6.00 p.m. Those who wish to remain at the Oratory can join in a period of quiet prayer following the arrival ceremony and / or attend a concelebrated sung Mass led by the Auxiliary Bishop of Birmingham at 8.00 p.m. There will then be devotions during an all night vigil.

Special ramble for the Service of Welcome and Joy for the arrival of St Therese Relics at 2 30 at Aylesford Friars and blessing of roses.

MEET :Victoria at 10 00 am for 10 18 train to Maidstone East (Arr. 11 11). There will be later trains to Maidstone East which, up to the 11 48 would still make it possible to reach the Friars in time for the ceremonies at 2 30 but the 10 18 train gives the best chance of securing a good position for the ceremonies as well as being able to get offpeak rail tickets. When we visited the Friars on the walkout they did not know how busy these ceremonies will be but it is normal to have crowds of over 3000 at Aylesford and, judging by reactions in other countries, these special days in honour of St Therese may be even more popular. LUNCH : Optional late lunch at the Malta Inn on the bank of the Medway or those who prefer can get a train from Aylesford station which is about half an hour's walk from the Friars.

TEA : Possibly at Maidstone.

DISTANCE : 8 very easy miles along the Medway returning from Maidstone East or Aylesford according to preference.

FARE : £13.00 OPR Maidstone East from Victoria; £8.40 from from boundary zone 6 both with Network Card. With Senior Rail Card the fares reduce to £10.30 OPR Maidstone East from Victoria and £5.55 from boundary zone 6.

MEET: Charing Cross at 0830 for the 0850 train to Aylesford (arr 1018, after changing at Strood). Trains from Victoria will be problematic because of engineering works near Swanley.

LUNCH: Optional at Fleur de Lys at Burham (grid reference 733609) after short easy ramble. Also possible to remain at The Friars for the departure of the Relics at 3.00 p.m.

TEA: Possibly in Aylesford village.

DISTANCE: 7 easy miles, returning from Aylesford.

FARE: £10.10 OPR Aylesford from Charing Cross, £5.55 from Zone 6 boundary, both with Network Card. Freedom Pass holders book OPR from Dartford to Aylesford, £5.00 with Senior Railcard.

A walk to celebrate the first day in London of the Relic of St Therese

MEET: For 9.30 Mass at the Carmelite Church, Church Street, Kensington. The nearest Tube station is High Street Kensington, which is ten minutes walk from the Church. Turn right outside the station in Kensington High Street. Walk along the High Street. At traffic lights turn left up the left hand side of Church Street to find the Carmelite Church on the corner of Duke Street. The walk will begin after the 9.30 Mass, which we expect will be about 11.00 a.m.

LUNCH: Willow Walk Wetherspoons, Vauxhall Bridge Road.

TEA: After lunch, people will be free to disperse or, if they wish, wait for the Mass of Welcome for the Relics in Westminster Cathedral at 5.30 p.m., followed by a formal service of Welcome at 7.00 p.m. DISTANCE: About 8 miles, returning from the Victoria area. No hills, no mud, lots of points of interest and dropping off points along the way.

FARE: Travelcard up to £7.50, but only after 9.30. Save up to £1.20 by showing Network Card at Train or Underground stations.

Thursday 15th October (Landranger Map 176)

The last of the series of walks to celebrate the visit of the Relic of St Therese to England

MEET: Tower Hill Station (at top of steps outside the entrance to station) 1000 ready for a 1015 start LUNCH: The Tyburn (Wetherspoon pub) Edgware Road

TEA: Westminster Cathedral Cafeteria or McDonalds. Victoria Street

DISTANCE: 10 miles, returning from the Victoria area. No hills, no mud, lots of points of interest and dropping off points along the way.

FARE: Travelcard up to £7.50, but only after 9.30. Save up to £1.20 by showing Network Card at Train or Underground stations.

We get to Westminster Cathedral 90 minutes or so before the St Therese ceremony to increase the chances of getting seats. If not concerned about seating, individuals can spend the time around Victoria Street.
