Dear Ramblers

At the time of writing it is three months since I left London and it seems as if I've been here forever.

Many thanks to all those who have written to me. I will get round to corresponding to individuals eventually.

In the parish where I am at the moment there is a rambling group and I've been out a few times already. We meet in the church car park and pile into whatever cars are available, or needed, and drive to the start of the ramble, and passengers make a specified contribution to the driver. It works out cheaper than public transport and gets us to places than might not otherwise be accessible.

Only one of these walks baa been a fat walk, along the coast at Dunbar where the Firth of Forth enters the North Sea. Part of the walk was along the edge of a golf course and part on the beach. The wealth of sea birds was marvellous but there were no eagles or albatross. The other walks have all been hill climbs and all but one, over a thousand feet. Boxhill would seem a dawdle now. We are practising for Ben Nevis which we plan to climb on 23rd May. I'm going swimming regularly to build up my stamina. It seems that the temperature at the top of Ben Nevis is likely to be 20⁰ lower than on the ground so it is to be hoped that the weather la generally warmer that day.

The variety of birds and wildlife we see on these walks is quite marvellous. On my first outing I could hear a strange laughing sort of sound, later I saw what it was - a brown fowl with black eyes and large scarlet eyebrows - and it let us get quite close so it obviously knew that it was long time till the 12th August.

The only disadvantage of this group is that they are all from the same parish, mostly families and the only socialising likely to occur is at parish events and birthday and anniversary dos but once I am more settled (flat sold and house bought) I shall be exploring other possibilities for socialising.

I am about to set off for my second return trip to London since my departure, but there is **50** much to do on those trips that I don't get much opportunity to meet up with anyone, but maybe one of these days I'll find the time to come out with the St Francis Ramblers.
