

Don't forget Sunday train services can be affected by engineering works. Information on these can be obtained by calling 08457 484950 or see National Rail Website at www.nationalrail.com. Please Note (this especially applies to trains which usually start at Charing Cross). Engineering work sometimes mean that trains are diverted to start from a different main line station, e.g. Charing Cross trains are diverted to start from Victoria or Cannon Street. It's wise to ring national rail during the week to ask if there are any special arrangements the following Sunday

Please ensure you bring your Network cards or Gold cards so that you can get the 1/3rd off full fares for yourself and up to three guests travelling with you. Unless otherwise indicated the fare shown is the fare from the London terminus to our destination. Most people can get a reduction by using a travel card for part of the journey.

Several Rail Companies now offer three or four tickets for the price of two so if a few members are at the ticket office at the same time it is worth asking if there are any deals going. The ticket clerks will not necessarily volunteer the cheapest way to travel.

News, Views and items of interest

Welcome to New members: A hearty welcome to Christine Conboy of Hatfield, Charmaine Harrington of Whetstone N2, Jim Murphy of Hanwell W7, Joan Pool of London SW5, and Zahira Uddin of Hornchurch and best wishes to them for many years of happy rambling with the club. This programme also goes to 20 people to whom the Membership Secretaries sent details recently and we hope to see them on walks and on the new members list in the next quarter. And congratulations to Gillian McLauchlan, Hania Poniatowska and Witold Sokolowski on attaining Life Membership.

Renewal of Membership: The clock is ticking for the renewal of membership. If you have not paid by 31 December your membership will be deemed to have lapsed and you will not receive the programme that will be dispatched in February or subsequent programmes. At the time of writing 60 annual members have renewed which means that more than 60 of those who were members last year have not yet renewed for 2006-07. If you are one of these please send a cheque for £5 payable to St Francis of Assisi Catholic Ramblers Club to the Treasurer (address in box on page 8 of this programme) to ensure that you continue to receive details of the club's activities.

Your new committee was duly elected at the AGM on 7 October. Full details are on Page 8 of this Programme and the Club's accounts for 2005-06 are on the last page. Please remember that the committee is elected at the AGM for the year ahead only. So at next year's AGM all posts will need to be discussed and voted on again as required by the club's constitution.

The AGM was attended by 38 members, about 16 per cent of the number of people in the club. I will leave it to you the members to decide whether that is a satisfactory proportion of membership to be making important decisions on the future of the club.

Life Membership. An important change in the conditions for life membership was agreed at the AGM. So from this time next year any member can apply for life membership and it will not be necessary to have been a member for 10 years prior to becoming a life member. The downside is that those becoming life members from October 2007 will have to pay 20 times the annual membership subscription and not 10 times as at present. This change has no effect on those who are already life members.

Oversees members: Another change introduced at the AGM was that from membership year 2007-08 members living outside the UK postal area will need to pay an extra £2 for membership. We are delighted that some of our members who have emigrated continue to maintain their membership of the club. However there is an extra cost involved in sending the programme overseas and the increase in membership subscription had to be introduced for this purpose.

Please remember in your prayers club members who are unable to walk due to illness. In particular we pray for John Lawrence who has been unwell recently. John is now living in St Mary's Nursing Home at Tooting Bec Gardens, Streatham.

Good Value B&B Courtesy of the Ramblers Association: This club has been affiliated to the National Ramblers Association since it was formed about five years after our club began walking. We get very little benefit from the affiliation and they won't even put a link to our website on their's!! However as a result of being affiliated we do get the Ramblers Association Year Book. This excellent publication contains details of high quality and good value Bed and Breakfast accommodation throughout the UK. If you are going away for a weekend or a longer holiday in the UK you might like to have a look at the list for ideas on where to stay. I (Tony Finnegan) can loan you the year book or let you have a copy of details of B&Bs in a particular county you might be visiting.

Please publicise the Club in your Parish Church: Enclosed with this programme there is a card carrying a copy of a notice board announcement which we would like displayed on every parish notice board. Please check whether there is one up already in your Church. If there is, then replace it with this one so that this year's membership secretary details are publicised. Day of Recollection, Sunday 25 March 2007: This time we have chosen a new venue the Brigettine Centre at Fulmer Common Road, Iver Heath (convenient to Uxbridge and Gerrards Cross). It will be necessary to pay £18 (or £13 if not sharing the Bridgettine lunch) in advance and there will be very little time after the publication of the next Newsletter. So if you intend going please let Anne Dunne know as soon as possible and send her a cheque for the relevant amount payable to the St Francis of Assisi Catholic Ramblers Club. In the next programme we will include a deadline for payment (probably around 10 March).

Easter Week at Wells-Next-The-Sea, Norfolk 10th – 14th April 2007: Maurice Hickman is organising an Easter break at Wells-Next-The-Sea in Norfolk and has already booked in for himself at Wells Youth Hostel for the nights of Tuesday 10th of April to Saturday 14th April 2007 inclusive. Going by last year's timetables, we will catch an 11.30 train on the Tuesday from Liverpool Street to Sheringham for a late lunch and then the North Norfolk coast 'Coast Hopper' bus service to Wells, arriving there at about 4.30 pm. On the following Sunday we will return on an 11 am bus back to Sheringham for a lunch stop before catching the 1.54 pm train, arriving back at Liverpool Street at about 5pm. The Apex fare in 2005 (booked over a week in advance) was £22. The hostel does not provide meals but it has self-cooking facilities and there are plenty of places to eat out around town in the evening. The coastal area is rich in bird life and Walsingham is only a steam train ride away. Those coming should bring something to eat for breakfast at least for the first day.

Wells hostel is now closed for the Winter period and those wishing to come should apply to Sheringham Youth Hostel. It is advisable to ring first to confirm that beds are still available. If you wish to stay at the Hostel you are strongly advised to book **as soon as possible**. The Hostel is already fully booked for the Bank Holiday period! The overnight charge is £14; i.e. £70 if you stay for the 5 nights. Maurice also has details of guest house and B&B accommodation. The phone number of Sheringham Youth Hostel is: 01263 823215. 
