**Please ensure you bring your Network cards or Gold cards** so that you can get the 1/3rd off full fares for yourself and up to three guests travelling with you. You can also get an all zone travel card for £4.80 using your network card at a rail or underground station.

Unless otherwise indicated the fare shown is the fare from the London terminus to our destination. Most people can get a reduction by using a travel card for part of the journey. Also look out for deals on South West trains which often allow three or four people travelling together to travel for the price of two.

**There is a very good offer on the Southern Railways Website** (www.southernrailway.com) where, seven days before you travel, you can book a one day off peak rover ticket to travel anywhere on Southern's network for £10. Four people together get it for just £20 altogether.

## Future Dates for Your Diary

# Monday 18 September to Monday 25 September Holiday in Dumfries & Galloway, Joining up with Peter Culba's Lakeland holiday in Keswick (25 September - 2 October).

Staying in guesthouses in Dumfries for 7 nights. Cost £20-£30 bed & breakfast per night for a single room. Travel to Dumfries by train (probably about 11.46am) from Euston, changing at Carlisle; takes about 5

hours. For cheapest fares it's important to book in advance. Options available are £11.55 (Advance C) or £15.50 (Advance B) for a single ticket with Senior Rail Card, subject to availability. Travel to Keswick: train from Dumfries to Carlisle and then bus to Keswick; takes about 3 hours. Travel cost about £17 (reduction available with railcard).

Walking up to 8 miles with sightseeing. Attractions include forests with red squirrels,

prehistoric hill forts, historic castles and abbeys, scenic hills and coastlands.


