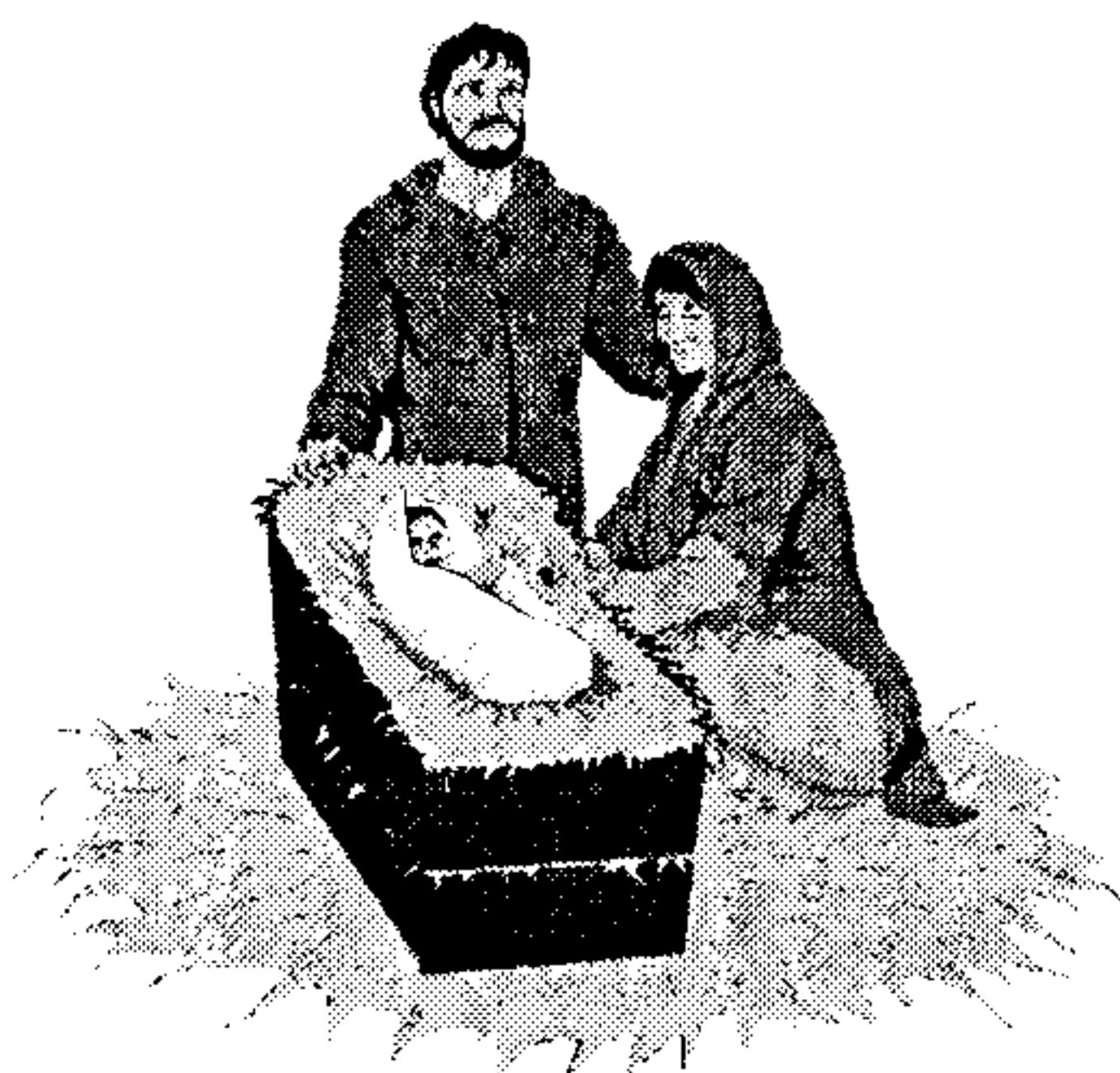

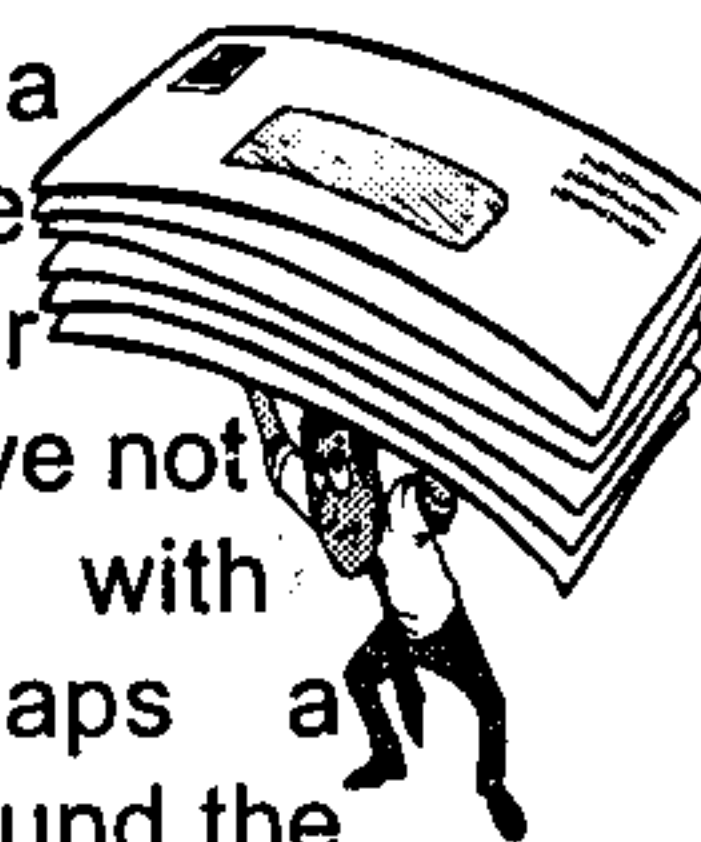

And finally... as it’s winter, don’t forget your torches just in case a walk cannot be finished in daylight.

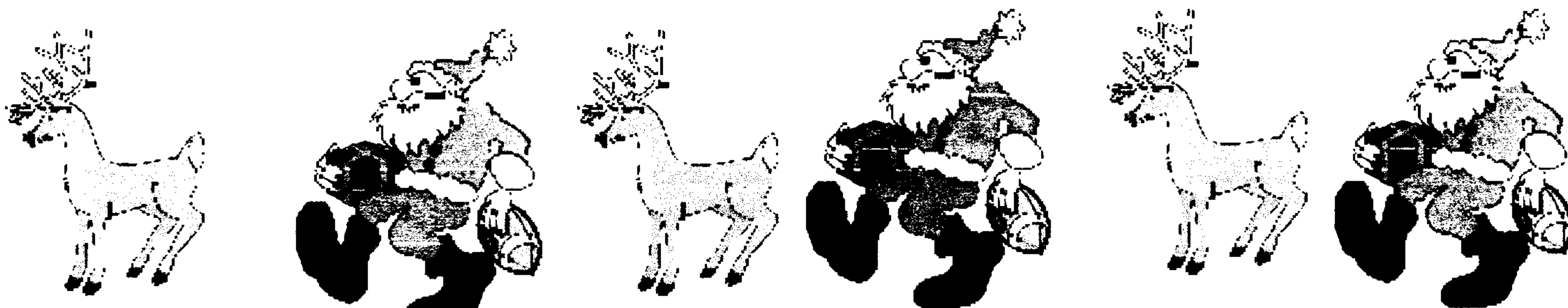

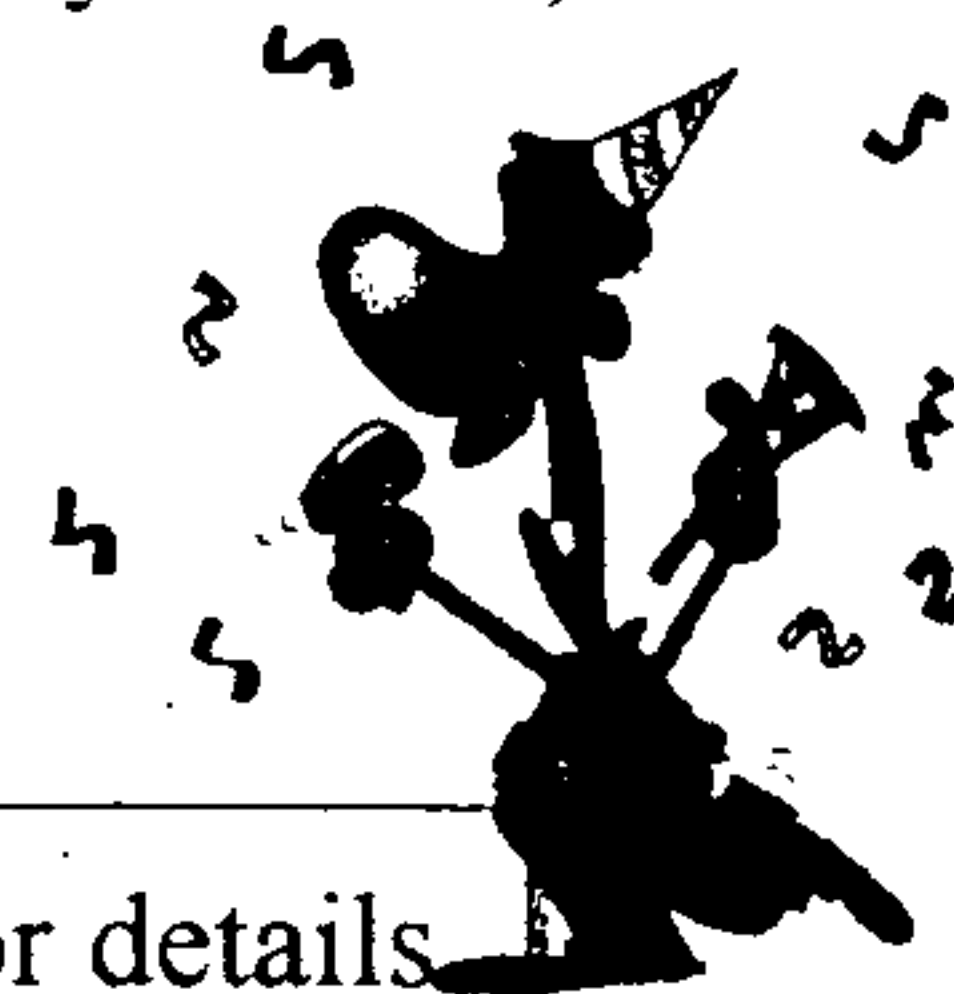

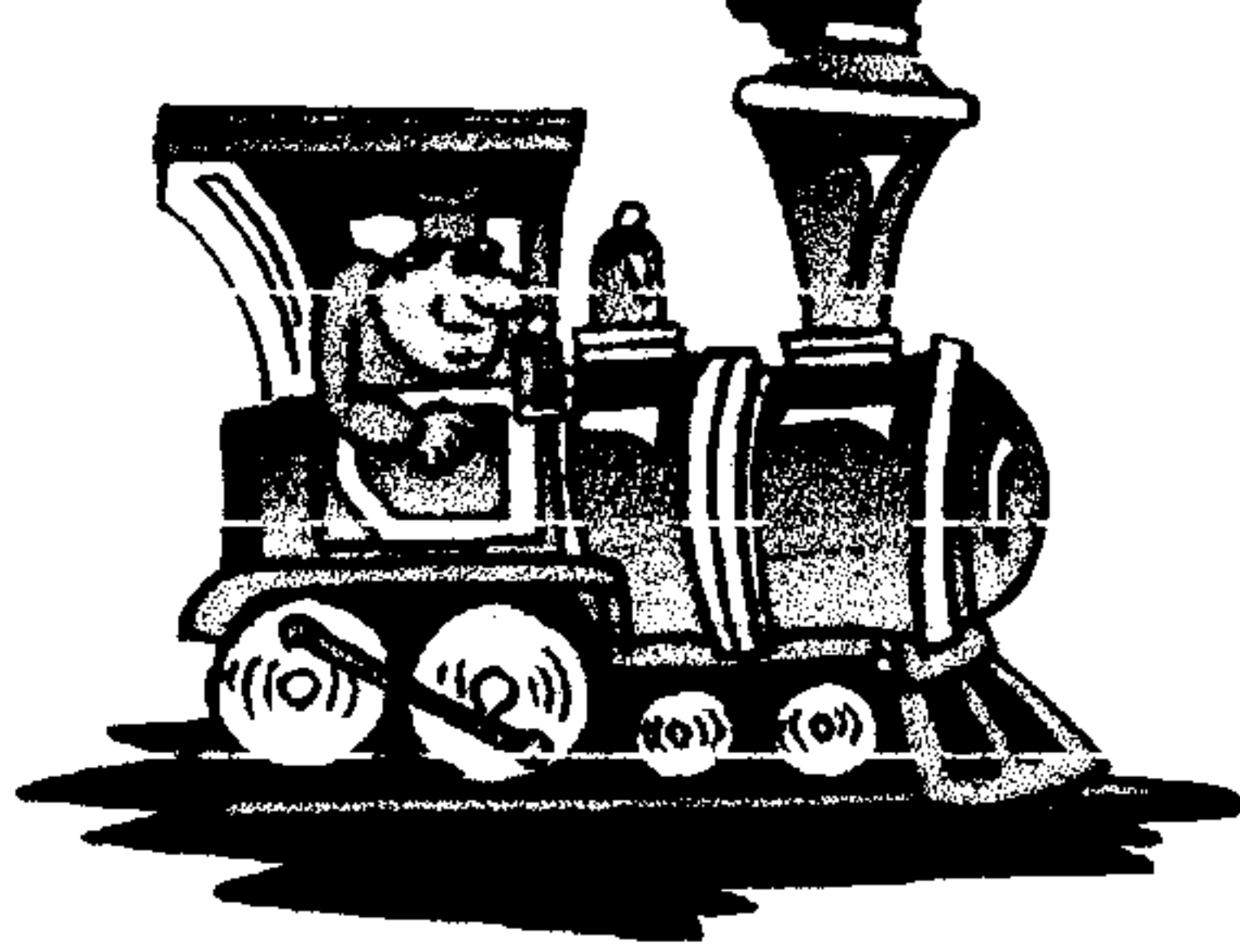

MINUTES OF THE 71st ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON SATURDAY 13th OCTOBER 2001 at 3pm IN ST MARY MOORFIELDS CHURCH HALL

Refreshments were provided by Helen Hunt and Peter Lobo and were served to members on arrival from 2.30pm.

Helen Hunt welcomed everyone and opened the meeting with the Prayer of St Francis.

Apologies for absence were received from: Robert Slater, Mary Hennessy, Phil Carolan, Bernadette Cahill, Colette O'Harte, Catherine Martin, Katherine Grey, Anne Richardson, Catherine Scott, Rena Borg, Maureen Furlong.

Helen read the minutes of the 70th AGM which were agreed. There were no matters arising from the minutes.

Secretary's Report: The Secretary's report was given and accepted; a copy is attached. Fr David Barnes said he felt honoured by our special celebrations for his Silver Jubilee. Gillian said there was a picture of the celebrations in the Westminster Record with a mention of the Club.

Treasurer's Report: Copies of the accounts had been given out.

Income

Subscriptions were down. As usual many had been members for only 1, 2 or 3 years. Others dropped out due to emigration, retirement and sadly death. Last year the AGM agreed to close the Club History account so this was transferred to the Income account. Both our social events made a profit. I am grateful to members who pay subscriptions in advance - gives confidence in the future.

Excess expenditure over income may look small because of the Club History transfer but bear in mind the money was already in the bank.

Year Account Loss £292.87

Ramble List Compiler's Report: Paul said it had been a very interesting year. There were the speed restrictions after the Hatfield train crash and the re doing of the programme because of footpath closures due to foot and mouth. He thanked those who had come forward with replacement walks. Hilary McNabb thanked Paul for keeping the walks going, other clubs had cancelled their walks programme. There was a lot of discussion as to whether contact names for the 'Tortoise walks' should appear in the programme. Paul said details should appear in the walks list, people might not like to ring someone they don't know. Short and long walks could take place on the same day or short walks could be done on Saturdays, some rambles have drop off points. John Lawrence thought people wanting short walks would want to do them over the whole day. Maureen Cahalane said these walks were to events which are only known about after programme had come out. Hanna said they were changed at last minute according to the weather, she thought contact numbers should go on first so that anyone interested would know about it and not feel excluded. John Burbage said such walks would not be covered by the Club insurance. Tony Finnegan pointed out that the Club's insurance only covered third parties.

Maria Darroch gave the Membership Secretary's Report. She had had 57 enquiries, many after the mention of the Club in the Westminster Record. Mike Hoffman thought our card, although beautiful, was too dark and did not stand out. Antoinette said the new card will be brighter. John Burbage said he had had only 3 enquiries between January and June but this was to be expected because of the problems with the railways, rain and foot and mouth. John visited Parish Priests to ask if they would put our notices up.

Election of new Committee: Antoinette Ratnam, was willing to continue as Secretary. Gillian McLauchlan was willing to continue as Treasurer for another year. Paul Connolly was willing to continue as Ramble List Compiler. Mary Maxwell, Nick Peterson, John Burbage and Maria Darroch were willing to continue as Committee Members. Robert Slater was unable to continue as a Committee member. Mike Hoffman said he was willing to stand for the Committee. There being no other candidates they were all duly elected.

Election of Auditors: John Lawrence and Tony Finnegan being willing to continue as auditors were re appointed.

Any Other Business: John Burbage and Nick Peterson proposed that the subscriptions increase from £4 to £5 in October 2002. This was carried. Betty said that a recent ramble had not started from the station given in the programme. The leader said this was due to engineering works, if he had gone to the station the ramble would not have reached the lunch stop in time. Intending walkers should check for engineering works and if there are any ask the ramble leader if any changes would be made. Paul suggested that if a leader has to make changes on the day they should let him know so that he can explain what had happened. There are five club badges left, a decision will be made whether to keep the old design or have a new one. John Burbage suggested showing the blue club programme sheet would help newcomers find the Club at the London station.

Tony Norton was congratulated on his reception into the Church last June.

Antoinette thanked Peter Lobo for doing the teas at the AGMs, we appreciate it very much. She also thanked the other committee members for their hard work and commitment to the club during the year.

Margaret Moran thanked Antoinette for her sterling work as Club Secretary.

The meeting finished at 4.20, followed at 5.30pm by a Mass for Club members.

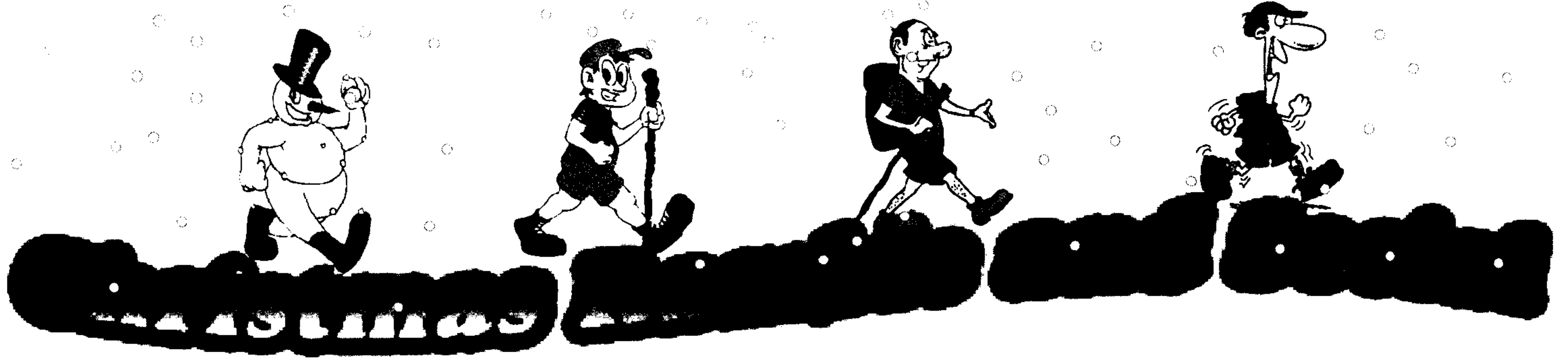
